FEW HOLDS BARRED

RULES AND RECULATIONS IN STOCK

Fewer hard and fast rules are laid down for "stock" car racing than for any other sport. Apart from starting, the only stipulation for actual racing is that drivers must not leave their cars until the race ends and deliberate fencing is not allowed. Except for obeying flag signals, nothing is barred.

- 1. Official numbers given to drivers MUST be painted on both sides of the car.
- 2. Silencers must be removed and exhaust pipes must extend outside the body of the car.
 - 3. Windscreen (if used) must be of safety glass and all other glass removed.
 - 4. All doors to be welded or strapped shut.
- 5. Seats and upholstery must be removed and a bucket seat welded or bolted in position.
 - 6. Steel roll bars and bracing must be fitted rear of driver.
 - All cars to be fitted with hard-top roofs.
 - 8. Wheelbase must be standard.
 - 9. Drivers must wear crash helmets and be strapped into their seats.
 - 10. All cars to be fitted with front bumpers to specified design.
- 11. Wheels must be standard. Tyres may be of any make. Wheel discs to be removed.
- 12. No spare wheel or equipment or ballast must be carried during racing.
- Drivers must not leave their cars until the race ends, except if race is stopped.
- 14. Each car must be fitted with self starter in working order and must leave the pits and starting line under its own power.
- 15. Petrol tanks must be fitted inside the car.
- All competitors must keep to the track except in the interest of safety.
- 17. Drivers of cars breaking any rules will forfeit starting money and/or prize money. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

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






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
